- Do NOT perform peer-review
- Standardized: OAI-PMH compatible
- Pre-prints and post-prints
- Data and datasets

Share Alike	 		Yup, AND they must license the new work under a Share Alike license.
No Derivatives	 		
Non-Commercial	 		Yup, AND the new work must be non-commercial, but it can be under any non-commercial license.
Non-Commercial Share Alike	  		Yup, AND they must license the new work under a Non-Commercial Share Alike license.
Non-Commercial No Derivatives	  		





- Policy on Access to Research Outputs (July 2012). In effect April 1st, 2013
- Intramural research
- Green or gold open access
- RCUK compliant journals
- Green compliant repositories
- Article Processing Charges (APCs)

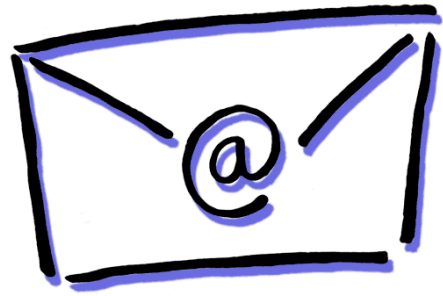
Working Group on Expanding Access



- Accessibility, sustainability, excellence: how to expand access to research publications
- OA journals “main vehicle” for publishing research
- Repositories only for theses and dissertations, etc.
- No licensing recommendations
- Against short embargoes
